 - Positive I failed because I did not study enough, I did not study the correct material, I did not have enough background, but I will work harder to do so...
- Is GPA important?
- YES!!! Employers tend not to look at resumes of people of less than 3.00 GPA.
- NO!!!! Employers look at students with high GPA and NO experience with caution.
